Justice

This week's selection from the Book of Wisdom makes clear, "Justice is undying." As humankind is made in God's own image we are to make God's Justice real in this life. Why is it important to bring about Justice? It is important to do so because, "God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living." God's creation is good. It is His aim to have harmony and good.

Saint Paul addresses the issue of Justice in his letter to the Corinthians. Corinth was a prosperous port city. Yet, the prosperity did not reach to all who lived and worked there. Thus, Paul makes clear those with much must share it with those who do not have much. Sharing what one has with others shows one to be a true imitator of Christ. As Paul writes, "Not that others should have relief while you are burdened, but that as a matter of equality your abundance at the present time should supply their needs, so that their abundance may also supply your needs, that there may be equality." There is reciprocity to Justice.

God always reaches to His creatures to rescue, protect and provide for them. This includes humanity and *all* other creatures. The psalm celebrates this. "I will extol you, O Lord for you drew me clear and did not let my enemies rejoice over me." Today's gospel passage most poignantly shows us examples of Justice.

Picture the first scene in the Gospel. A large crowd of people surrounded Jesus. His "handlers" were ushering him through the crowd. Any Secret Service officer of today would have been alarmed. It was too easy for someone to harm Jesus.

Surely enough the sick woman was able to press in undetected and touch Jesus. No one saw it happen. At first Jesus did not see her. Yet, he felt something happen to him. He felt power go out of him.

As it was said above, this story is poignant. Jesus is very sensitive to people's needs. He senses *healing* power go out of him. Without a conscious thought Jesus heals. It is God's nature to spread healing love to all who sincerely seek it. The woman's physical ailment is cured. Notice, however, what takes place next.

Jesus looks around. He wants to know who touched him. The woman was fearful. Yet, Jesus' intent was not to scold her or to punish her. Jesus wanted to face the person. God not only "fixes" a problem He walks with the person. The Lord develops relationships. In this case he commends her for her faith in him. He speaks soothing words to her.

As the Body of Christ, we continue God's healing ways. By the power of God's Holy Spirit we have the means to be touched by others permitting them to touch God, like the lady in the gospel.

Day after day we encounter fellow human beings reaching out for help. There are people who are out of work and hungry or working a job that is earning below what is needed to survive. Members of our community who have physical and mental health challenges need firm support and guidance. Whole communities of humanity who are persecuted for practicing their faith in God need a new homeland and protection in order to survive. Justice is due to all of us.

Justice is what every human being is due. Each of us has dignity. We all have been created by God. As we are followers of Jesus Christ we share in the responsibility for one another's needs, just as the scriptures have made known to us today. Justice is what disciples of the Lord practice. Filled with the Holy Spirit we have little choice but to work for Justice. We may not be consumers of religion who expect "the Church" to do for us. We are the Church. We must reach out and do with others. Such is a part of how we find our own salvation.

Brothers and sisters, even if we decide not to work for Justice it will be done. In some way the Lord God in all mercy finds the way to embrace and help people in need. God's Justice is real and it is undying.
