### God's Word Will Be Spoken

Have you noticed those who minister in our parish? There are many. Some you see and some you do not. You might have said thank you to some and you might have given others a hard time. Regardless of your treatment of those who minister here God's Word will be spoken.

Look at the readings for today. Each main character from Ezekiel to Paul to Jesus is given a hard time. They are shown disrespect and their message not listened to. Yet, God the Father sends his messengers and indeed His only Son regardless of the people's manners. God never gives up on wayward people. Moreover, He has high expectations of those He sends to speak His word.

The words of Ezekiel stand out. "[T]he spirit entered into me and set me on my feet." One gets a vision of God lifting the prophet up off the ground and setting him on his way. Ezekiel had no choice. By the force of God the prophet speaks!

Saint Paul tells of the "thorn in his flesh." He recognizes God keeps him humble and that he may only boast of Christ's power and not his own. Paul learns to trust in God's care and support. In the midst of trial and weakness it is God's success that emanates from Paul's work. He discovers, "when I am weak, then I am strong."

To be a prophet of God demands a focus on God's word and message and not on how people will receive it. The prophet must be obedient as well as informed and wise.

All that has been said above is personal to me. The psalm response resonates with me. "Our eyes are fixed on the Lord, pleading for his mercy." It is a plea close to my heart. I am dependent on the Lord's Grace and Mercy. God called me to the priesthood and a prophetic ministry. I cannot claim any credit for this calling or ministry myself. It is all from God. What fool would deem to be a prophet on his own? Self-proclaimed prophets should be approached with some skepticism.

As it was for Ezekiel, God sends the prophet among those who are rebellious. I have experienced this. There is no earthly glory in the ministry. As Pope Francis warns priests, the priesthood is not a career. God expects obedience of the one he sends. The prophetic person will speak for God and the speech will be forceful. It will confront the people. Further, the message spoken will not win the prophetic servant of God friends. As the Lord says to Ezekiel, "they shall know that a prophet has been among them."

To those of you who minister in our parish I say, God's Word will be spoken. Do not let fear of ill treatment put you off. Let each of us keep focus on the Lord and His Church. Fraternal support must be offered to one another. If our fellow parish members do not accept the message we bring to them we

must bring it anyway. Our strength will be in the Lord and seen in our service to others.

Remember the words of the psalm (Ps. 123). "To you I lift up my eyes who are enthroned in heaven – as the eyes of servants are on the hands of their master."

God's Word will be spoken.

- **HYMN #1: BLESS THE LORD (Canedo) (Angrisano/Mannibusen)**
  1. **Bless the Lord, O my soul, bless God's holy name. Bless the Lord, O my soul, bless God's holy name.**
  2. Remember the kindness of our God, (**clap, clap, clap, clap**) who showers us with blessing all our days.
  3. Remember the justice of our God, (**clap, clap, clap, clap**) who stands with those forgotten and confused.
  4. Remember the healing love of God (**clap, clap, clap, clap**) who calls us to be whole and to be free.
- **PSALM 123:** Our eyes are fixed on the Lord, pleading for his mercy.
- **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: (ALLELUIA)** The Spirit of the Lord is upon me for he sent me to bring glad tidings to the poor.
