Isaiah 58: 7-10 Psalm 112 1 Corinthians 2:1-5 Matthew 5: 13-16

The Interior Light Is Seen In the Exterior Light

In the gospel passage Jesus says, "your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." Jesus notes the people are the "salt of the earth." He recognizes they do have an interior spirituality. There is an understanding and experience of God's love within them. Therefore, He urges them to bring it out, to share it. Salt needs to be used, applied to the food, otherwise its flavor is not appreciated.

In the second reading Paul acknowledges, the spirit of God to be the root and cause of his preaching the Word. Paul's experience of God's love for him causes him to preach. Paul shares his interior love of God.

Through the Prophet Isaiah God directs us to share bread with the hungry and to shelter the oppressed and homeless. As we do so God answers our cry to Him. The Lord is very pleased to see people care for people. He loves seeing His love shared, like salt being used. Thus, God will bless those working for Him.

This parish stands as a platform for many apostolates that reach out to the community. Many people do the work of God in these apostolates. Through their work they display the loving concern God has for all His creatures. We, His creatures, actually, are the ones acting in the power of God's mercy and justice.

Foremost, we the parish are a spiritual force in the area. We gather to pray, worship, study and celebrate. From this, streams many services we render in the cities we reside.

The parish partners with the City of Oakland Park to provide green open space through our Cherry Creek Park. Abundant food is provided to hundreds of people every week. Several members of the parish visit the sick in private homes and institutions. In the very daily and weekly Liturgies our brothers and sisters minister "in front" of the congregation and behind the scenes too.

Thus, salt is mined, and salt is used. The way that we all comport ourselves in our work, home and leisure lets people know we love God and God loves us. And God loves them through us.

Thus, as individual Christians called together as one body in Christ we must reach out to people in need. The work we do expands outside of our parish boundaries. There is a specific way we reach out beyond our boundaries.

We reach out together with our brothers and sisters of all the parishes of our Archdiocese. Our many parish "lights" gather as one very big fire.

We reach out together through the Archbishop's Charities and Development Drive. The explanation and call to make your tithe to this drive has already been sent to your home. For those of you who are new you will respond through the literature given to you in the church.

Make sure you make your pledge and pay it off during these next several months.

Let your interior light of faith and gratitude to God be seen as an exterior light.
