Baptisim for Infants and Preschool Children under 7 years old

At Baptism, infants and preschool children are initiated into the Christian community and begin a life-long journey as a committed disciple of Christ. Since the child cannot make this commitment on their own, the parent who requests Baptism states that they wish to pass on the faith in which they believe and live. Parents wishing to have their infant or preschooler Baptized are required to attend Baptism Preparation. This gives them the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of Baptism and to have their questions answered concerning the Sacrament of Baptism and the ceremony. In order to begin preparing for their child's Baptism, parents are asked to contact the parish office at 954-564-1010 prior to the anti- cipated birth or adoption process. Are There Gifts You Ought To Give To The Lord?

Through the Prophet Isaiah the Lord says, "Raise your eyes and look about; they all gather and come to you.... Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow, for the riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you...."

What abundance comes to those who share what they have. What we have comes from the Lord and is what we give to Him. Through the faith of Jerusalem the Messiah, the Savior, comes. By the people's willingness to submit to God's gift of Grace, other people have the chance to share in that Grace. It is in the willingness to share that Grace flows. Yes, God's Grace flows through each of us who walk by faith in Him. This is how God appears to the world, His Epiphany.

To share the gifts already given to us and to be ready to share the gifts promised to come is Justice. Today's psalm says "...with your judgment endow the king ...he shall govern your people with justice and you afflicted ones with judgment." The proper judgment is what leads to good Stewardship! God appears in Just actions. We must insure this happens.

Saint Paul recognizes the great gift he has received from God. He is grateful Christ appeared to him and saved him. From his gratitude flows his understanding of what he must do. Paul must share Christ with others! Paul speaks of this when he says in Ephesians, "you have heard of the Stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit." By his preaching and care of the people, Paul helps Christ to appear to them.

Matthew addresses how one comes to recognize the kingly power of Jesus in one's life.

The Magi story speaks of a God who comes for all people.
