Baptisim for Infants and Preschool Children under 7 years old

At Baptism, infants and preschool children are initiated into the Christian community and begin a life-long journey as a committed disciple of Christ. Since the child cannot make this commitment on their own, the parent who requests Baptism states that they wish to pass on the faith in which they believe and live. Parents wishing to have their infant or preschooler Baptized are required to attend Baptism Preparation. This gives them the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of Baptism and to have their questions answered concerning the Sacrament of Baptism and the ceremony. In order to begin preparing for their child's Baptism, parents are asked to contact the parish office at 954-564-1010 prior to the anti- cipated birth or adoption process. January 21, 2024 The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jonah : 1-5, 10 Psalm 25 1 Corinthians 7: 29-31 Mark 1: 14-20

An Immediate Response Is Preferred

Jesus exhorts, "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." (Mk. 1) He prefers an immediate response. Will you commit your life to the Lord's way?

The Lord is aggressive going after people to follow Him. What you see take place in the gospel story is unusual. Jesus seeks students to join Him. Normally it is the other way around. Students come to the teacher.

Scripture scholars point out this notion in the gospel is much like that found in Proverbs 1:22. Wisdom is personified. She calls her followers. Wisdom promises her followers a higher life. Jesus is doing the same thing. He promises them better fishing.

As Jesus calls the men, today's passage says they "abandoned their nets and followed Him." The actual translation says they "followed Him straightway." This echoes John the Baptist. He cried out in the desert for

people to make straight their ways (Mk 1:3).

Likewise, God calls you personally. God seeks you! Will you commit yourself to following Him?

In the Book of Jonah, God is calling and asking Jonah to serve Him by announcing a message to the people. From this passage alone one does not see the whole story. Jonah is reluctant to do God's will. However, God forces his hand. Moreover, even though Jonah only responds partly and weakly,1 the people of the city respond greatly! The Lord's work gets done, period. The Lord is pleased with the people of the city.

Yes, God might be forcing your hand. He wants you to be His Steward and do His work. You are being compelled to respond with no hesitation. If God must, He will get it done even if you are reluctant. It is probably best to go with Him immediately.

The ABCD is how we, the people of Blessed Sacrament Parish, make an investment in people other than ourselves! People are thankful to us, they truly are. Therefore, you in faith must now reach out and make a pledge to the ABCD for this year.

Remember the formula for tithing. Tithing is the Biblical term that means Ten Percent. At least Ten Percent of your worth or income goes to the Lord's service. Six percent of your wealth and income goes to this parish. One to two percent goes to the ABCD as an investment in our brothers and sisters who are in need.
