Baptisim for Infants and Preschool Children under 7 years old

At Baptism, infants and preschool children are initiated into the Christian community and begin a life-long journey as a committed disciple of Christ. Since the child cannot make this commitment on their own, the parent who requests Baptism states that they wish to pass on the faith in which they believe and live. Parents wishing to have their infant or preschooler Baptized are required to attend Baptism Preparation. Isaiah 63: 16b-17, 19b; 64:2-7 Psalm 80 1 Corinthians 1:3-9 Mark 13:33-37

God Is Faithful. Let Us Resolve To Follow His Guidance.

On this First Sunday of Advent, this First Day of the New Year of the Church, Saint Paul addresses us with these words: "Brothers and sisters: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ."

We have a journey to take.

Today we begin the walk of Faith toward fullness and fulfillment in the Lord. God calls us to Fellowship with His Son. God will be with us all throughout the journey. As Saint Paul states in his first Letter to the Corinthians, "He will keep you firm to the end, irreproachable on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful."

Advent is a time of active watching and waiting. We know God is omni present. He is all around us. So, we actively reach out to the Lord. We remain aware of His presence so that we may benefit from His Grace. Furthermore, our actively waiting for the Lord means we will be able to recognize His presence in the Second Coming. And, brothers and sisters, that is what Advent is about. It is making ourselves ready to meet the Lord when He comes again.

The Prophet Isaiah (first reading) states, "No ear has ever heard, no eye ever seen, any God but you doing

such deeds for those who wait for Him. Would that you might meet us doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways!"

God has performed such awesome deeds throughout history. Indeed, God has done so in our time and in our personal lives. Stop, reflect, and take note. What are such deeds that God has done in your life?

As difficult as you might perceive your life to have been so far, even in the midst of the difficulties, one who is alert and aware spiritually sees God's deeds. Even as we falter, we know God may lead and guide us in right ways and so we may accept His correction. God will correct us for He is loving. God created us as good, and God is invested in our growing in goodness.

So, let us take heed of what we say in the psalm today (Ps 80), "Rouse your power, and come to save us."

Plead for God to use His power to guide us in right ways. Let us resolve to follow His guidance.
