The Passion

The Passion of the Lord Jesus Christ was not a merely pious act. It is not simply a devotedly religious act. It is not indicative of the status quo. It does not bring serenity.

The original event of the Lord's passion and its yearly commemoration is shocking. It is visceral. It is a buffet to the face. It is an event that may awaken you to the reality of suffering, your suffering, and the suffering of others.

The passion of our Lord has a prominent place in the consciousness of Christians. And so it is prominent in the Church's ritual. Christ and his community of faith must pass through the passion to reach the Resurrection, Ascension, and Pentecost. Along with Jesus Christ, we journey in this direction.

The passion reminds us that if we suffer hate due to Christ's name it is because he was hated first. He was hated for caring for the poor and disenfranchised. If you experience these things here on earth might it be because you care for the same?

Remember the story in the Gospel of the poor man and the wealthy man. When both died the poor man who suffered much on earth went to be with Abraham. He was comforted much. The wealthy man was separated from the others across a great abyss and suffered for eternity.

The passion compels us to see in the face of Christ the faces of others who suffer. We see our brothers and sisters who suffer poverty, discrimination, and neglect. To stand with them will bring us the same passion Christ suffers. He sees those who suffer such injustice still.

The Passion has the potential, if we need it, to free us from sin. Then, freed from sin, we may know the joy of being one with Jesus Christ.
