

Baptisim for Infants and Preschool Children under 7 years old

At Baptism, infants and preschool children are initiated into the Christian community and begin a life-long journey as a committed disciple of Christ. Since the child cannot make this commitment on their own, the parent who requests Baptism states that they wish to pass on the faith in which they believe and live. Parents wishing to have their infant or preschooler Baptized are required to attend Baptism Preparation. This gives them the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of Baptism and to have their questions answered concerning the Sacrament of Baptism and the ceremony. In order to begin preparing for their child's Baptism, parents are asked to contact the parish office at 954-564-1010 prior to the anti- cipated birth or adoption process. Fourteenth Sunday In Ordinary Time July 7, 2024

Ezekiel 2:2-5 Psalm 123 2 Corinthians 12:7-10 Mark 6:1-6a

An Ordinary Guy

Jesus was an ordinary guy. His father Joseph was a tradesman, and he was to be also. When Jesus showed up teaching about God he got into trouble with the people. "Where did this man get all this?" Moreover, "... they took offense at him."

One will note the treatment given Jesus is similar to that given to the prophets before him. Yet, even as his own blood family did not support his ministry, Jesus already saw others as family. In Mark 3:34-35 the point is made, "And looking around at those seated in the circle he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."" (Mk. 6)

In the first reading we encounter the prophet, Ezekiel. He is pressed into service while the people are exiled in Babylon. They were exiled because they did not heed God previously. Thus, the people are known to be "hard of face and obstinate of heart." That is, they are rebellious in their external actions and are so internally in their heart. Thus, they are difficult to reason with and work with.

Speaking to the peoples' actions and attitude, God forewarns Ezekiel of what he is facing. So, he makes clear Ezekiel has God's authority to speak to the people. No matter what their attitude toward the prophet they will know God has spoken to them. God tells Ezekiel, "But you shall say to them: thus says the Lord God! And whether they heed or resist ... they shall know that a prophet has been among them." In other words, God will get His will done. The people will sense the presence of God even as they are hard and obstinate.

All who are recruited by God to be prophetic are reluctant. Most are just common guys. It is not a highly paying prestigious job. And, before one acts as a prophetic person, he or she must discern the matter with care. Are you truly called? Like Jesus, we are all ordinary guys and gals on the surface. Surprisingly, or not so surprisingly, God may work through each of us. Naturally, we are not Jesus, God. But God can work through each of us. As such, let us respect and

honor each other as Christians. Take note when a very ordinary person you meet gives you solace and a loving hand. And don't be surprised when you may give the same to another.
