#### Baptisim for Infants and Preschool Children under 7 years old

At Baptism, infants and preschool children are initiated into the Christian community and begin a life-long journey as a committed disciple of Christ. Since the child cannot make this commitment on their own, the parent who requests Baptism states that they wish to pass on the faith in which they believe and live. Parents wishing to have their infant or preschooler Baptized are required to attend Baptism Preparation. This gives them the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of Baptism and to have their questions answered concerning the Sacrament of Baptism and the ceremony. In order to begin preparing for their child's Baptism, parents are asked to contact the parish office at 954-564-1010 prior to the anticipated birth or adoption process. # July 28, 2024 Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 Kings 4:42-44 Psalm 145 Ephesians 4: 1-6 John 6: 1-15 We Need to Be Fed

The stories in 2 Kings and John's Gospel both speak to feeding the hungry people. In the first reading, the people were nearly poisoned prior to the moment written about in today's passage. In both 2 Kings and John, it is barley loaves that satisfies the crowds. Barley loaves are meant for the poor. The wealthy would not eat them. Furthermore, the loaves were given from the "first fruits" of the harvest. That is the best of the harvest. The best of the harvest is always given to the Lord's service. It is shared for the good of all.

The miracle story in today's gospel passage is one found in each gospel. Again, barley loaves are involved. Moreover, only a small number of them were available to feed many people. The feeding takes place near the Passover time. There is a plentitude of leftovers after all are fed. Care is taken to collect and preserve the leftovers. Nothing goes to waste.

God makes sure His people are fed. His people are those who follow His leaders. They followed because they sincerely look for salvation. God gives the people knowledge of His existence and love. As well, God gives example of how to live in response to His loving presence.

Yes, God does exist. God loves you and me, all of us. He loves people who do not love Him. He cannot force love on us, however. Sharing in His love happens as each of us is open to the Lord and joins in His community of faith, the Church, and follow its disciplines. Doing so makes it possible to benefit from His love.

The reality is this. Each of us longs for wholeness of life. We want to know we have value and dignity and we have a need to be needed and accepted. In other words, we need to be fed.

Do you feel empty in some way? Or, perhaps do you wish to be more full? It is not selfish to desire fullness of life. Fullness of life is what God calls us to have. In humility we come to accept God's blessings. In return we praise, thank and bless the Lord. We offer ourselves back to the Lord in the form of service. We give our first fruits to Him. All of this is expressed in the Eucharistic Liturgy each Sunday.

As we are fed, we feed others too. Feeding others by the abundance of God's Grace is what is expressed in the sign of the leftovers. It is natural to be this way when we are in unison with God.

We need to be fed.
