Baptisim for Infants and Preschool Children under 7 years old At Baptism, infants and preschool children are initiated into the Christian community and begin a life-long journey as a committed disciple of Christ. Since the child cannot make this commitment on their own, the parent who requests Baptism states that they wish to pass on the faith in which they believe and live. Parents wishing to have their infant or preschooler Baptized are required to attend Baptism Preparation. This gives them the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of Baptism and to have their questions answered concerning the Sacrament of Baptism and the ceremony. In order to begin preparing for their child's Baptism, parents are asked to contact the parish office at 954-564-1010 prior to the anticipated birth or adoption process. Kingdom Etiquette, It Brings Peace

In every kingdom's realm there is an expected way of behaving. That is, there is a proper etiquette.

Authority in God's kingdom is given that a particular person will give effective leadership. It is not given that the individual may apply power to cause him or herself to have undue personal gain or selfish recognition. Today's readings highlight this point.

The Old Testament reading speaks of people who appear selfish and jealous. "Let us beset the just one, because he is obnoxious to us...." It is interesting to note they seem to recognize he is just. It shows irony. Further, that he is "obnoxious" to them indicates they have been confronted with their own, perhaps, unjust ways.

In their own skewed sense of justice, the speakers in Wisdom want to put God to the test. They will see if God will defend the just one when they assault him. Speaking of etiquette, testing "the king," God, in His own kingdom is risky if one has any concern for one's own wellbeing.

Giving in to passions brings conflict. It is hard to weed out the desire for distinction and power. This is the case regarding those persons closest to Jesus. In the gospel passage, these people do not understand Jesus' teaching. They cannot because they are blinded by their passion for authority. Jesus says, "If anyone wishes to be first he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Proper etiquette in God's kingdom comes when the people focus on Jesus' suffering service as a model for life as His disciple.

Saint James, whose letter is a moral exhortation to baptized members of God's kingdom, makes clear jealousy and selfish ambition cause disorder and foul practice. However, James says, Godly wisdom is pure. It is "peaceable, gentle, compliant, full of mercy and good fruits, without inconstancy or insincerity. And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace for those who cultivate peace." Kingdom etiquette brings Peace. Reflect on this.

Who do you know who cultivates peace? What criteria

do you use to determine "greatness"? Who would Jesus put in our presence today in calling us to care for the least and the most vulnerable? What is your passion? Does it bring peace or conflict?
