Baptisim for Infants and Preschool Children under 7 years old At Baptism, infants and preschool children are initiated into the Christian community and begin a life-long journey as a committed disciple of Christ. Since the child cannot make this commitment on their own, the parent who requests Baptism states that they wish to pass on the faith in which they believe and live. Parents wishing to have their infant or preschooler Baptized are required to attend Baptism Preparation. This gives them the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of Baptism and to have their questions answered concerning the Sacrament of Baptism and the ceremony. In order to begin preparing for their child's Baptism, parents are asked to contact the parish office at 954-564-1010 prior to the anticipated birth or adoption process. We wish to celebrate this joyful time with you!

### Sum Up the Law!

In the time of Jesus, Jewish people demanded their rabbies give a summary of the Law. It has been said there were 600 precepts of the Jewish Law at the time. As my old scripture professor once said, "if anything was needed for salvation it was a good memory." (Fr. Eugene Maly)

The Old Testament (Deuteronomy) gives a summary of its own. It is called the Shema'. "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone!" This is the basic principle of the Mosaic Law. It is the keynote. Since the Lord alone is God, we must love Him with undivided heart. It is a creed. It reminds the people of their special relationship with the one true God.

When Jesus is asked to sum up the Law He states the Shema' as the first law. Then He adds Lev. 19:18, the love of neighbor, as the second. The two are not the same. Love of God must be recognized first. Flowing from this is love of neighbor and self.

Love expresses itself in love of neighbor. Note the Scribe agrees care for others is greater than any other sacrifice.

Fr. Eugene Maly points out that to say "Lord" is more than to speak of a creator. It means "loving saving God" who has reached into our lives in deep and profound ways. Both Old Testament and New Testament say this. This action of God comes first! We cannot love God and Neighbor on our own. We must accept God loves us and loves us first. Accepting the Lord God's love for us makes all love possible. It makes it possible to love God, neighbor and ourselves.

Both loves, love of God and of neighbor, sum up the Law.
