Baptisim for Infants and Preschool Children under 7 years old

At Baptism, infants and preschool children are initiated into the Christian community and begin a life-long journey as a committed disciple of Christ. Since the child cannot make this commitment on their own, the parent who requests Baptism states that they wish to pass on the faith in which they believe and live. Parents wishing to have their infant or preschooler Baptized are required to attend Baptism Preparation. This gives them the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of Baptism and to have their questions answered concerning the Sacrament of Baptism and the ceremony. In order to begin preparing for their child's Baptism, parents are asked to contact the parish office at 954-564-1010 prior to the anticipated birth or adoption process. Life Is a Journey in Faith

Today's feast of the Epiphany is the most important of the Christmas Season. Yes, it is greater than Christmas Day. Many cultures around the Christian world celebrate it with greater emphasis than they do December 25th.

The Magi are featured in the story. They are defined variously. In profane Greek, the word *magos* may mean a member of the Persian priestly caste or the possessor of occult knowledge and power or magician or a charlatan. In our story from Matthew 2, they are possessors of occult knowledge as implied regarding their use of astrology. Matthew's story also reflects much from the Old Testament regarding the coming of a King-Messiah.

Epiphany means the appearance of something or the coming to awareness of something. Sometimes, one might say he or she just had a great epiphany as to say, "I just realized something". Thus, the Christian epiphany is to find the King-Messiah. In the case of the Magi, they knew something special had just happened. This child they were led to was of great importance. Yet, they might not have fully understood the fullness of revelation in front of them.

The magi were not Jewish. They were gentiles. Thus, the Gospel makes the point that later is very clear at the Passion of Jesus Christ. Jesus' own people did not "get it". He was not recognized or appreciated by the Jewish nation. They were not ready for the coming of the Messiah! But, others did and do have a revelation. At that, even the Magi continued on their journey. Still seeking.

Brothers and sisters, how much are we still seeking? Is there not a yearning within to fill in emptiness? Do we not step back and wonder how much farther we need to go to find fulfillment?

The feast of Epiphany is important because it forces us to look at our own journey. Do not focus on gifts brought to Jesus. The draw of the story is more to wonderment concerning Jesus. It is, "who is this child?" Why is He important? What does he have to do with my life? Why do I and all the world celebrate the Christmas Season at all? Non-Christians do too.

You might do well to reflect on the above questions. It is good to make a spiritual reflection and renewal. Such inquisitiveness helps in the spiritual need for understanding, even for the most ardent believer. Earthly life is a journey in faith and we together as a faith community must keep on the journey.

Pray that God will continue to reveal to us His presence in the Word and Eucharist. Let us commit again and again to the journey.
